

Upward Bound Participants Receive the Moody Scholarship!

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Established in 1969, the Moody Foundation initiated the Moody Scholars program to provide financial assistance to qualified high school students in their pursuit of an undergraduate degree. Three Upward Bound participants were selected as finalists for the 2020 - 2021 Moody Scholarship including Kelsey Barillas, Evelyn Hernandez, and Ashley Hinojosa.

In the fall, Kelsey will attend the University of Houston - Clear Lake on a Pre-Med track. Evelyn and Ashley both plan on attending Galveston College. Evelyn wants to become a pharmacist., and eventually transfer to the University of Houston. Ashley is interested in becoming a PA or doctor.



Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship Recipient

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has committed more than \$500 million to Texas youth and education. Each year, the Rodeo awards more than 800 scholarships. For 2021, the Rodeo committed to award \$14 million in scholarships, \$5 million to junior show exhibitors, \$2 million in educational program grants and \$470,000 in graduate assistantships. Applicants are evaluate based on academics, leadership, and financial need.

Kelsey Barillas is one of the recipients of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo scholarship. The scholarship recipients represent 51 different counties in the state and will attend 19 different Texas colleges and universities with various fields of study. Each recipient will receive \$20,000 toward a four-year undergraduate degree.

Ashley will attend Galveston College in the Fall. She is pursuing psychology, and plans on going in a Med or PA track.




Ashley Jimenez

2021 SUMMER COMPONENT







Galveston College's TRIO Upward Bound hosted an in-person and virtual summer component! Current participants had the opportunity to complete a sixweek academic program, with two days in-person, two days working from home, and Friday trips. The courses were taught by certified teachers and/or college instructors. Students not only completed courses to help them remain academically prepared for high school, but they prepared them for the online college courses that they may choose to take as they transition to college after graduation or as an early admission/dual credit student. Students were placed into courses that they plan on taking during the upcoming academic year. Students gained a head start on the curriculum and received instruction from their possible future teachers. Courses offered are designed to strengthen skills and to introduce new material in English, mathematics, science, foreign language and computer science.

Additionally, our recent graduating seniors and earlyenrollment students participated in an in-person
Summer Bridge program. Students enrolled in
summer courses at Galveston College received
individual support through advising and tutoring. All
students had the opportunity to engage in advising,
study hall, wellness, college visits, and
cultural/educational enrichment activities. Students
also attended several mental health workshops
hosted by the Gulf Coast Center.













Taking the next step. College Visits

This summer, participants had the opportunity to visit three universities in-person.

Students learned about educational opportunities close to home at Texas A&M Galveston. They explored all things "ocean-oriented" that the campus has to offer, including the Maritime Academy.

At the University of Houston - Clear Lake, the participants got the chance to tour the campus, including its newest additions: on-campus housing, STEM building, and Recreation Center.

Last fall, students attended a virtual University of St. Thomas information session and campus tour. Students had the opportunity to visit in-person this summer, and discover more about the Rising Stars program. The Rising Stars program pairs students with corporate sponsors in order to earn funds toward tuition. This model helps students build personal connections that will influence them beyond college.
